Editor: Deadlines, decisions, referees

Associate editors: Reviews, decisions


Managing editor: Tracking, process

- Exclusive submission
- 'double blind' (PhD no issue)
- Reject vs sent for review

Reviewers' comments


- For author

- Reject
- Conditional acceptance
- Revise & resubmit
- Accept

- -> revised paper
- -> response to reviewers




RESPONDING TO REVIEWERS


- 1. Get angry! But never respond when angry
- 2. Take what you can to improve your paper
- 3. Explain changes. 'Trade-offs'
- 4. Complete revisions promptly
- 5. Reject: 'not suitable' vs 'no good'

3. Submitting a paper

- Target a journal

- Reference check: What journals do you cite?






S ubstance

- Methodology sound
- Data collection appropriate
- Informed by literature

Significance

- 'So what'!?
- Contribute to emerging issue? Debate?
- Link to theme at centre of discipline?
- Interesting findings? Interpretation?
- Significance: Introduction, conclusion




S_{tyle}

- Sokal hoax
- Writing for readership


