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Violence or insecurity? Case of Macedonia

Feeling of insecurity and uncertainty

- "Lack of political will" instead of rule of law
- Selective justice and corruption
- Malfunctioning of the system
- Decreasing trends due to high dark number
- Trans-generational transmission of domestic violence
- Adoption of new legislation and changing the existing

World Health Organization's definition

- the intentional use of physical force or power,
- against oneself, another person, or against a group or the community,
- that either results in or has a high likelihood of resulting in:
 - □injury,
 - □death,
 - □psychological harm,
 - ☐mal-development, or
 - **□**deprivation

Act of violence

Murder - someone has deprived another of life

Aggravated murder - deprivation another of life:

- in a cruel or treacherous manner;
- by committing domestic violence;
- while intentionally endanger the life of another person;
- from greed, in order to commit or to cover up another criminal offence, for ruthless revenge or for other petty motives;
- on order;
- for the purpose of extracting an organ, tissue or cells for transplantation;
- knowing that she is pregnant or deprivation of life the minor; and/or
- a public prosecutor, an attorney, an official or military person, while performing their function

Multiple murder - intentionally deprived of life two or more persons and was not being tried for those offences previously

Manslaughter - committed on the spur of the moment

Killing on Request - act of euthanasia

Negligent Homicide - someone has caused death to another person out of negligence

Infanticide - committed only by the mother toward a baby during the childbirth or immediately after the birth (delicta propria)

Bodily injury: inflicts bodily injury to another or impairs another person's health

- basic offence (upon a private lawsuit)
- due to domestic violence
 - on the spur of the moment

Aggravated bodily injury: serious bodily injury or severely impairs another person's health,

- due to domestic violence
- with very severe health consequences
- death of the victim
 - out of negligence
 - on the spur of the moment

Participation in an affray – fight that results in the death or serious bodily injury of another person


Act of violence:

- violent behavior (when someone mistreats, roughly insults, endangers another person's security or performs rough violence which causes a feeling of insecurity, threat or fear in the public)
- violence related to sport activities
- violent behavior by the group
- violent behavior toward the group


Data regarding violent criminal offences

- State statistical office's annual reviews
- Period: 2007 2015
- no even one committed criminal offence "Killing on request"
- no specific statistical data for different paragraphs of the same article from the CC punishing different modus operandi



Numbers of convicted perpetrators (homicide) according imposed criminal sanctions







Conclusions

- There is a need of research through the court and prosecution files for gathering data that will enable deeper analyzes of the violent crimes in Macedonia
- Violent offences are at the third position right after property offences and offences against pubic traffic
- Offences of physical assaults are much more frequent
- Motives remain unknown
- Relations between offenders and victims, also
- No data regarding attempted murders
- No data regarding weapons and/or misuse of alcohol/drugs as reasons for committing violent crimes
- The victim are underestimated within official statistical reviews
