General information

The Global Initiative against Transnational Organized Crime (GI-TOC) and the European Public Law Organization (EPLO) are pleased to welcome you to Athens for the Scientific Colloquium: Teaching organized crime and corruption course in South East Europe, from 21st to 22nd October 2022.

Organized crime and corruption are ever growing and ever-changing phenomena. Globalization of both has led to the adoption of two mega anti-crime conventions: UNTOC and UNCAC, and the negotiations on a Cybercrime Convention.

Both organized crime and corruption have many manifestations and dimensions. The same can be said for the varying response approaches, which include, the normative, criminal justice and law enforcement, financial and economic, criminological and victimological, etc. Therefore, different legal and social science disciplines as well as research and teaching methodologies are used.

On the international level, GI-TOC launched the first Global Organized Crime Index, UNODC has launched a series of organized crime, corruption and integrity teaching modules and manuals to facilitate academic teaching and professional training. Transparency International is measuring corruption through the Corruption Perception Index (CPI) and other relevant analytical tools.

Universities and research institutions in the SEE region are teaching/training both organized crime and corruption in different formats and levels (undergraduate, legal clinics, masters and PhD).

The main objective of this Scientific Colloquium is to provide a forum for the exchange of views and experiences as well as to present the international instruments, facilitators of teaching and training.

The main expected outcome of the Scientific Colloquium is to enrich the teaching options and methods as well as to provide a platform for the focused exchange of experience, while ultimately striving to improve knowledge so as to capture the ever-changing forms, manifestations and impacts of organized crime and corruption locally, regionally and globally.
