










Balkan Route

European Trafficking Methods

- Cocaine flows using Business jets from South America and West Africa
- Heroine and cannabis most frequently trafficked with lighter aircraft and smaller aircraft (helicopters, drones, etc)

COVID 19 changes in drug trafficking

- Border Closures
- Stay At Home Orders
- Limited Transit
- Limiting or shutdown of manufacturing

Countries implemented different levels of policy leading to varied levels of changes in trafficking.

Impact of Covid-19

Border Security Changes

- Increased border stops
- Increased border seizures

Stay at home orders

- More local stops
- Increased individual delivery

Limited transit


- Air traffic flow slowed or stopped
- Fewer legitimate goods and services moving

Limited/shutdown manufacturing

• Unavailable "precursors" used to in drug manufacturing

Seizures of opiates as recorded in the UNODC Drugs Monitoring Platform, February to April 2020



The last 5 years have seen a steady increase in case numbers










Countries of origin of shipments on major darknet markets, 2011 and 2021




Southern Border


