






Research focuses

 Delinquent violence – unlawful use of force by person(s) towards another person(s) against their will with the exclusive or primary intent to inflict physical harm or to kill









Can we measure violence?



"Genuine violence classification system"







Parameters for quantity of violence in particular act of violence

- Duration
- Injury
- Vulnerability of victim
- Instrument
- Motive

Key tasks

- Establishing 1 Central Violence Lab in Zagreb and 3 Regional Violence Research Lab in Split, Rijeka, Osijek
- 12 clusters
- Operational Violence Research Lab database







Key tasks

- Pilot study on 'dark figure' of delinquent violence
- Testing "genuine violence classification system" using data from 2016/2017 homicide research
- Final "genuine violence classification system", published and offered for commercial use
- Violence Research Lab "genuine violence classification app"







Key tasks

- Violence Research Lab Strategy on preventing and detecting delinquent violence and cyber harassment
- Targeted manuals and protocols
- Over 20 journal articles, 50 presentations
- 8 diploma/master thesis on Violence Research Lab
- 2 edited books (English and Croatian version)







METHODOLOGY







Methodology

- 8,000 10,000 case analysis/2,000
 - over 200 relevant prosecutorial and both criminal and misdemeanor judicial offices in Croatia
 - Time period of analyzed cases: 3 years
- 200 conducted interviews/ 40
- self-report- victimisation survey; self-report-delinquency survey
- 16 field studies







Criminology vs. Criminal law

- CRIMINAL LAW = normative perception / CRIMINOLOGY = social reality
- Criminal law abstraction vs. Criminological reality
- Criminological research main source: criminal justice system
- How do we deal with normative concepts, figures and institutes in criminology?
- Example I: 12 year old A shoots at B violence? YES
- Example II: Insane A hits B in the head violence? YES
- Example III: In self defense, A kills B violence? YES







Rules, figures and institutes I

- Attempts should be included in criminological research of violence (attempted homicide or completed heavily bodily injury?)
- Criminally Insane Perpetrators should be included in criminological research of violence
- Omission and commission should be included in criminological research of violence (letting a baby starve to death vs. throwing a baby through a balcony)







Rules, figures and institutes II

- Exclusion of Unlawfulness 'Justified' Violence should be included in criminological research of violence (e.g. self-defense)
- Negligence should be included in criminological research of violence (negligent homicide vs. murder = violence)
- Instigation should NOT be included in criminological research of violence (verbal expression=violence?)


Definition of violence translation into normative framework? Methodological & sampling challenges?
